Purpose of the ministry

Within Holy Trinity, we seek to know Christ better and make Him known by ensuring the congregation can see all required service items by operating the projection equipment.

What the role involves

1. Time and day of team activity or meeting.
Sunday Morning – 9.15am - end of service, plus 10 mins post service.
Sunday Evening – 5.45pm – end of service plus 10 mins post service.
Ideally it would be 2 duties per month
2. How often do we meet? Other
3. How much time commitment is required per meeting? 2-3 hours
4. What is the role of a volunteer? To ensure all items that need projection are displayed at the appropriate time during a service. This means arriving in time to check the requirements and news slot content and liaise with the band leader.
5. Is preparation required for meetings?
